



Florida Fast Facts American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 was signed by President Obama on February 17, 2009. This legislation will pay for needed transportation improvements in Florida while providing jobs and other economic benefits. This Fact Sheet provides estimates of Florida's anticipated funding and related information.
