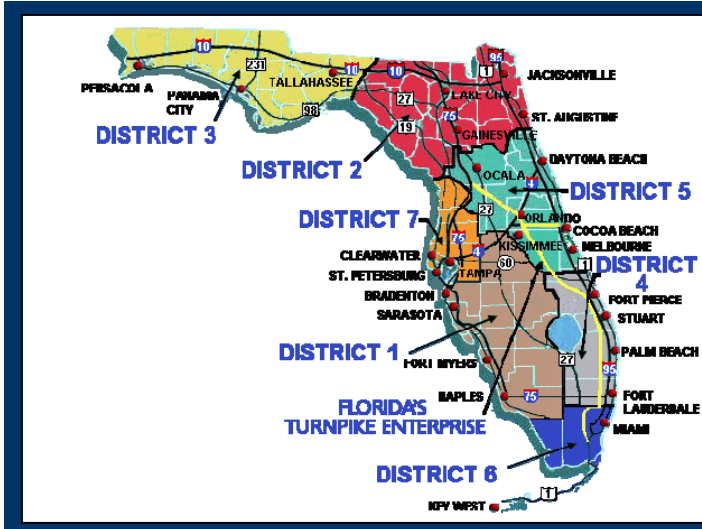


Transportation Improvements – Florida at Work

ARRA Implementation Status in FDOT District Seven

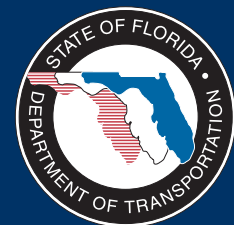
- 67 ARRA projects totaling approximately \$244 million are being implemented in District Seven, including:
 - 4 roadway capacity improvements
 - 27 resurfacing projects
 - 13 transportation enhancements and operational improvements
 - 21 transit projects
 - 2 airport projects
- Over \$50 million have been obligated on 23 multi-modal and transit projects
- 43 ARRA roadway projects totaling \$212.2 million have been advertised to date
- 41 ARRA roadway projects totaling \$188.2 million have been awarded to date
- 41 ARRA roadway projects totaling \$193.9 million are under construction or complete.
- 45 ARRA projects are located in Economically Distressed Areas (Citrus, Hernando, and Pasco)

ARRA Project Highlights

- The I-4/Lee Roy Selmon Expressway Connector project will provide 34 lane-miles of new elevated expressway connecting I-4 to the Port of Tampa.
- The U.S. 41 widening project will create 6 lane-miles of additional roadway capacity in Pasco County.
- The U.S. 19 reconstruction project near S.R. 60 will ease congestion, improve safety, and provide quicker travel times for evacuations in Pinellas County.
- The 27 resurfacing projects in Citrus and Hernando counties will improve almost 82 miles of roadway.
- The 7 enhancement projects will create 8 miles of new trail, over 23 miles of trail improvements, and 0.2 miles of streetscape throughout the Tampa Bay area.
- Almost \$37 million will be used to fund transit improvements such as new buses, equipment, and shelters; ADA improvements; and other passenger amenities.
- More than \$13 million will be used to rehabilitate Taxiway B at Tampa International Airport and the terminal building at St. Petersburg-Clearwater International Airport.
